Famous Unitarian Universalists in Black History

Rev James Reeb was a UU Minister from Boston who answered Rev Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s call to come to Selma and march. Rev Reeb, and two other UU ministers, marched with Dr. King across the Edmund Pettus Bridge on March 11, 1965. James Reeb was murdered by white suprematists that evening.

Viola Riuzzo was a Detroit activist who helped with logistics for the successful Selma to Montgomery March. She was murdered by members of the KKK on March 25, 1965.

Famous Black Unitarian Universalists

Francis Ellen Watkins Harper 1825-1911 Author, Abolitionist, Suffragist. She defied racial and gender-based expectations of her day. She was one of the first US published Black women.

Fannie Barrier Williams 1856-1944 educator, civil rights, and woman's rights activist. She got black people officially represented on the Board of the Columbia Exposition in 1893.

Egbert Ethelred Brown 1875-1956 He founded a Unitarian church in Harlem, and became a leading voice in promoting the independence of Caribbean nations and liberal religion during the Harlem Renaissance.
