Come a bit before and we can chat prior to the service. Come to:



2025 is the 200th anniversary of the founding of the American Unitarian Association (AUA)

On May 26, 1825, the American Unitarian Association was formed at the Berry Street Conference in Boston with the approval of bylaws.

Prior to that, in 1819, William Ellory Channing, in his pivotal Baltimore Sermon, preached about a benevolent, loving God who had endowed humanity with innate goodness, rationality, and the wisdom to discern between good and evil.

Channing decided to snatch the label of Unitarian from those who degraded it and to claim it proudly as his own.

Prior to this our Unitarian ancestors called themselves liberal Christians.

By 1825, however, many Unitarians had
grown comfortable with the term, so it was prophetic and bold to
formally claim the name "Unitarian" for the institution of the AUA.

It's important to note that the AUA was an organization for individual ministers, not congregations. Since congregations couldn't join the AUA until much later, in 1884, it took Unitarian churches a while to figure out how to relate to the AUA.

Unitarians thought of themselves as a tract society, or a pamphlet society: they exchanged ideas this way, and promoted Unitarian beliefs this way. Universalists, on the other hand, put a great deal of energy into evangelizing by horseback and itinerant preachers.
