Recognize Pride Month and Renew Your Wedding Vows at UUFBR 💑 💑 🟂

Every year, the month of June is recognized as Pride Month to honor the contributions to society made by lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, intersex, and other people of diverse sexualities and genders (LGBTQ+). **On Sunday, June 2, 2024, the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Boca Raton (UUFBR)** offers a unique and heartfelt experience for same-sex couples and their opposite-sex allies. UUFBR invites LGBTQ+ couples to celebrate their love by participating in a non-denominational mass wedding vow renewal ceremony.

The vow renewal ceremony provides a moment of romance and recommitment as UUFBR recognizes Pride Month. As we celebrate our LGBTQ+ community, we reaffirm the rights of every person to live free from discrimination and persecution based on who they are or who they love. This open and inclusive event encourages all couples, regardless of their background, to join in the celebration of love and unity before the beloved community.

The Reverend Kathy Tew Rickey, interim minister for UUFBR, expresses her enthusiasm, "I will always hold dear the memory of standing outside the Pittsford, New York Town Hall in the Summer of 2011. I was holding dozens of red roses and my calling cards. The roses I offered to same-sex couples in celebration as they emerged, beaming with marriage licenses in hand. With my calling card, I offered to officiate their wedding ceremony pro bono. I performed five same-sex weddings that summer, all joyous occasions."

The struggle for LGBTQ+ civil rights started with the Stonewall Riots in 1969. Same-sex marriage has been an important milestone because a legal marriage provides over 1,000 rights, protections, and benefits to spouses. Thus, Unitarian Universalists have understood that marriage equality is the inherent right of every person."

Today, our Unitarian Universalist principles call us to seek justice, equity, and compassion in human relations. Further, we are called to resist political barriers to marriage equality and LGBTQ+ rights in states like Florida. Our Fellowship in Boca Raton is welcoming to the LGBTQ+ community.
